

HOW TO WRITE AN ABSTRACT FOR THE ECCN6

This is just an example of an abstract. Abstracts must be written with MSWord. Please, use Din A4 page with 3 cm margin on both sides and 2.5 cm superior and inferior margins. Use Times New Roman 12 throughout. The title should be written in capital letters and should be short (less than 100 characters including spaces, if possible) descriptive and appealing. The presenting author's name should be underlined and its full postal address and email be provided. If there are two presenting authors just give the data of both authors and underline their names.

A short introduction should be followed by a concise description of the main ideas, results and conclusions with details on the methods if required. The maximum length of the full abstract will be a single page. Avoid the use of abbreviations but, if needed, define them at the first use. Use special characters sparingly. In the body of the abstract a 6 point space after each paragraph improves visibility. Justify the text on both sides.

Abstracts will be reproduced in the same conditions in which they are received for inclusion in the meeting documentation. They will not be subject to editing. The end of your abstract is a good place to name the funding agencies and projects.
